Would you like to provide feedback to CMS about the ESRD QIP?

CMS contracts with Westat to conduct monitoring and evaluation analyses of the End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) Quality Incentive Program (QIP). Each year, Westat speaks with individuals with ESRD-related experience to understand their perspectives on care delivery best practices, challenges, and patient experience. As a Facility Administrator, you are being invited to participate in a 30- to 60-minute interview with Westat. Participation in the interview is voluntary, and



names and affiliations will be kept confidential, meaning no individual or facility names will be used in the reporting of the findings.

2024 KDIGO CKD Guidelines Released

The guideline is intended for healthcare professionals who provide kidney care, people with suspected or diagnosed CKD and their caregivers, and for policymakers and commissioners of CKD services. The aim is to provide a useful resource that clearly and concisely addresses relevant questions with actionable recommendations to guide clinical practice based on a formal evidence review and consensus-based practice points. A wide range of key topics are addressed, including optimal CKD evaluation and classification, kidney disease risk management, management of complications, medication management and drug



stewardship in CKD, and strategies for delivering patient centered care across diverse clinical settings.
