Your facility or organizations DFCC patient lists and preview reports will be available for download in a new care compare module within the ESRD Quality Reporting System (EQRS). These reports will be available for download until the beginning of January 2025 DFCC preview period.

PY 2025 ESRD QIP Final Reports Available Soon in EQRS

The Payment Year (PY) 2025 Final Performance Score Reports (PSRs) and Performance Score Certificates (PSCs) for the ESRD Quality Incentive Program (QIP) will be available to download in the QIP section of EQRS on **November 6**th. Facilities are required to print the English and Spanish versions of their PSC and post both in a prominent location in the facility by **November 27**, **2024**.
