## Candida Auris: Front Line Forces

**Candida auris** (*C. auris*) is an emerging fungus that presents a serious global health threat. Data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) show a 60% increase in *C. auris* infections from 2019- 2021. The first two modules in this series are appropriate for direct care staff in all health care settings and covers the definition of *C. auris*, health concerns related to this fungus, risk factors that lead to the development of *C. auris*, how it spreads and ways to prevent its spread. The third module is appropriate for licensed staff and describes steps to take if *C. auris* is identified in a health care setting.
