## Medicare - Pay \$0 out of Pocket for Vaccines



People with Medicare Part D (drug coverage) pay nothing out of pocket for even more vaccines, making it easier to stay up to date with your immunizations. Reminder, Medicare also covers flu shots, COVID-19 vaccines, and pneumococcal shots. Medicare Part D covers these vaccines and more at no cost to you: shingles, RSV, Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis), Hep A, and Hep B (if you're at risk for the virus).
